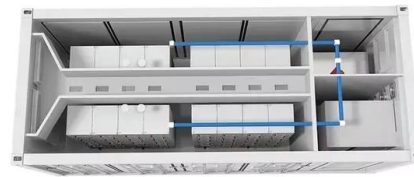


### Has vs. Have: What's the Difference and How to Use Them Correctly

Does she have a child? Has she a child? In American English, you need to use the auxiliaries do and does with the main verb have to form a question in the present tense. In British ...

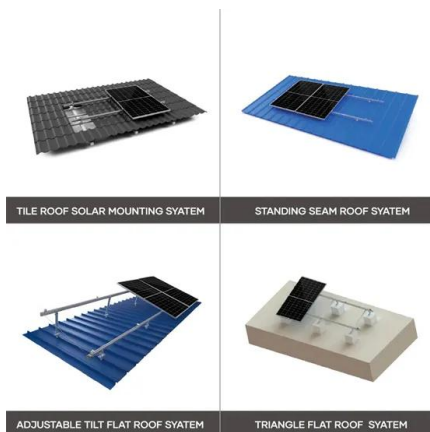


### contractions

### When to use 'is' and 'has'
